Engaging Young Community Peacebuilders

Rotary District 7305, being made up of Rotary Clubs in Southwestern Pennsylvania, is also a member of a larger group. Rotary Districts are organized in "Zones" with each "Zone" being comprised of roughly 34,000 Rotarians from many different Districts. We, District 7305, are a part of Zone 33 which covers the Mid-Atlantic and Southeastern Seaboard of the United States and the Caribbean countries.

Peter Kyle, Rotary International Director, oversees both Zones 33 and 34 has launched the largest local peacebuilding initiative in the history of Rotary International for the youth. It is entitled **YOUTH & PEACE IN ACTION**. Recently a webinar was held to introduce this exciting program to the District Leadership in the Zones and to get the ball rolling.

With support from 22 Districts in Rotary Zones 33 & 34, \$500,000 has been committed to provide peace education, training and project mentoring in collaboration with established peacebuilding partners. Our focus is high school students, teachers and youth service club members in communities where we serve.

Individuals spear-heading this program have very strong ties to the Rotary Peace Centers, Peace Scholars and other peace oriented organizations. The hope is to offer a curriculum to local high schools beginning in the Fall of 2021. Not wanting to reinvent the wheel, Rotary is looking to the Interact Clubs in the high schools to get the ball rolling. The goal is to have 875 total high schools and youth service organizations involved for the 2021-22 school year. Half of them can and should be high schools and service organizations that are Interact-focused or where existing relationships with Rotary Clubs exist that have a broader outreach to high schools and other service organizations.

The YPA steering committee has asked local Rotary Clubs to contact their Interact Club Advisor(s) and if possible high school principals to invite them to an information session in May where they can learn more, including how to register their school/students to participate. The North Allegheny Interact Club shared the following news with us as to how they used their \$500 prize from the District's Interact Trivia Challenge.

The North Allegheny Trivia Team members wanted to focus their project around the topic of food insecurity because it became such an immediate concern for families during the pandemic. Without some of the free and reduced lunch programs at local schools, many families were suddenly left without the resources they had depended on. In light of this need, the NA Trivia Team donated their \$500 prize to the Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank to help them in their efforts toward COVID relief. In addition, our Trivia Team members will take over our monthly Interact meeting in May to educate our members about food insecurity; they plan to focus on awareness, advocacy, action, and service. On top of their monetary donation, we donated seeds, soil packets, and planters made from recycled products to our friends at Pittsburgh Grandview for them to plant a backyard/school garden this spring.


